

## Bassenthwaite Primary School – Remote Learning Plan

In order to ensure that learning is continued, irrespective of lockdown and self-isolation, Bassenthwaite Primary School has developed the following plan. This plan offers remote learning opportunities whilst also acknowledging that some households have limited access to devices and would require hard-copies of work and resources.

This plan will be applied in the following instances:

1. An individual is self-isolating awaiting the results of a test/has a positive test within the household;
2. A group of children are self-isolating because of a case of coronavirus in the bubble;
3. A whole bubble or cohort is self-isolating because of an outbreak of coronavirus

The plan complies with the expectations and principles outlined in the DFE document [Guidance for Full Opening of Schools](#).

### **Software and online platforms**

Within all plans, teachers will set appropriate work in-line with our current curriculum, primarily supplemented by a range of resources provided by Hamilton Trust, Classroom Secrets, BBC Bitesize and Twinkl.

Children will remain in contact with their class teacher primarily through Google Classroom (to share successes and communications) and telephone calls.

These sites have been selected to support remote learning for a number of reasons. The lessons are in-line with our teaching ethos – they encourage the use of retrieval practice, explicit teaching with high quality modelling, and the use of deliberate practice. The online lessons are free to all and offer a recorded taught session so that the children can access physical teaching from a teacher and then access work relating to that lesson within the same website. There are also lessons specifically aimed at children with SEND needs and requiring additional support. Class teachers are to use the lessons in the classroom so children are familiar with the platform.

White Rose Maths and Classroom Secrets resources will be used as they are matched to our current maths curriculum model. Children are very used to seeing these resources.

Prodigy, Numbots, Accelerated Reader and Purple Mash will all be utilised to support the acquisition and retention of basic core skills.

Google Classroom will remain in use as the communication element has already proved to be invaluable. Teachers and parents will be able to message one another to share information and offer support. The Class stream page will offer the chance for teachers to celebrate children's work and maintain our school community.

**In the event of any form of isolation and loss of learning caused by Coronavirus, parents must understand that engagement in home learning is compulsory, as is the expectation that Bassenthwaite Primary School makes that provision available and accessible to all. However, if children themselves are too ill to attend then they should not be expected to engage in home learning. It is acknowledged that this will be a challenging time and access to devices may be limited if a whole household is isolating. Bassenthwaite School will endeavour to work closely with all families to ensure their individual needs are met.**

In preparation for home-learning, parents and children have received logins and passwords for the following platforms (likewise teaching staff need to be familiar with them):

- Google Classroom

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- Purple Mash
- Prodigy
- Numbots
- Espresso
- Education City
- Accelerated Reader

### Worksheets and Practical Resources

If a child is isolated from school i.e. the child is sent home from school to either receive a test or self-isolate as someone in the household is being tested, they will leave school **with a workbook and pencil**. Children will have immediate opportunity to continue their learning as staff are planning in the same format as during lockdown so that this can immediately be uploaded to Google Classroom.

### Remote Learning

The initial response to any isolation will be to provide children with online home learning materials and ensure they have the means to access this. Families who may need an additional device at this time, will be provided with a school laptop or paper copies of the work sheets (which may need to be delivered). In the case of whole cohort isolation, resources will be uploaded to Google Classroom and priority children will have packs delivered.
